Procedure:

Follow your Dept. procedures for risk assessment/training/PPE/equipment/facilities/NAPRA level

Part A:

1. Add approximately 950 mL of sterile water for irrigation/distilled water into the 1000mL graduated measure.
2. Add 8.0 mL of crystal light liquid to the water. Stir well until mixed.
3. Then q.s. to final volume of 1000 mL with Sterile Water for Irrigation.

Part B:


4. Measure 1000 mL of Lidocaine Viscous 2% into a separate 3000 mL graduated measure.
5. Then q.s. to 1700 mL with the crystal light solution (Part A). Stir well until mixed.
6. Transfer into amber bottles.
7. Label.
